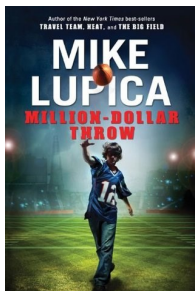

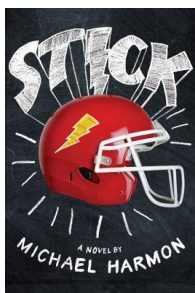


Million Dollar Throw by Mike Lupica

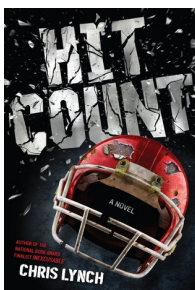


Stick by Michael Harmon

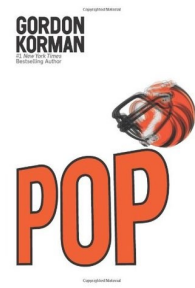


Hit Count by Chris Lynch

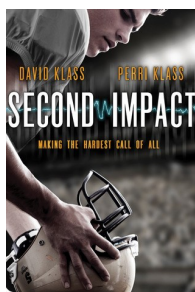


Pop by Gordon Korman
