

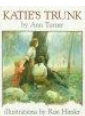
## Historical Fiction American Revolution

### Early Readers and Picture Books



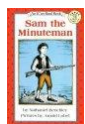
[George Washington and the General's Dog](#) by Frank Murphy

Recounts the events in the life of George Washington, that focus on his fondness for animals. (EARLY READER STE)



[Katie's Trunk](#) by Ann Turner

Katie, whose family is not sympathetic to the rebel soldiers during the American Revolution, hides under the clothes in her mother's wedding trunk when they invade her home. (J PICTURE BOOK TUR)



[Sam the Minuteman](#) by Nathaniel Benchley

An easy-to-read account of Sam and his father fighting as minutemen against the British in the Battle of Lexington. (EARLY READER BEN)

### Picture Books for Older Readers



[Redcoats and Petticoats](#) by Katherine Kirkpatrick

Members of a family in the village of Setauket on Long Island are displaced by the Redcoats and serve as spies for the Revolutionary Army of George Washington. (PICTURE BOOK (OLDER) KIR)



[The Scarlet Stockings Spy](#) by Trinka Hakes Noble

In 1777 Philadelphia, young Maddy Rose spies for General Washington's army by using an unusual code to communicate with her soldier brother. (PICTURE BOOK (OLDER) NOB)



[When Mr. Jefferson Came to Philadelphia: What I Learned of Freedom, 1176](#). by Ann Turner

In Philadelphia in 1776, Ned meets Thomas Jefferson, who is staying in his mother's inn while debating the topic of freedom in Congress and writing the Declaration of Independence. (PICTURE BOOK (OLDER) TUR)

In the year 1777, a group of Quakers and a party of Indians have a memorable meeting. (J BRU)



[Betsy Zane: The Rose of Fort Henry](#) by Lynda Durrant

In 1781 twelve-year-old Elizabeth Zane, great-great-aunt of novelist Zane Grey, leaves Philadelphia to return to her brothers' homestead near Fort Henry in what is now West Virginia, where she plays an important role in the final battle of the American Revolution. (J DUR)



[Changes for Felicity](#) by Valerie Tripp

The outbreak of the Revolutionary War in 1775 brings drastic changes to Felicity's life in Williamsburg, affecting both her family and her friendship with Elizabeth. (J PB AMERICAN GIRLS)



[Felicity Learns a Lesson: A School Story](#) by Valerie Tripp

Shortly before the Revolutionary War, nine-year-old Felicity, who lives in Williamsburg, is torn between supporting the tariff-induced tea boycott and saving her friendship with Elizabeth, a young loyalist from England. (J PB AMERICAN GIRLS)

Thirteen-year-old Jonathan goes off to fight in the Revolutionary War and discovers the real war is being fought within himself. (J AVI)



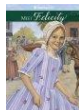
[Johnny Tremain](#) by Esthes Forbes

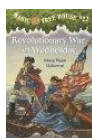
[Meet Felicity: An American Girl](#) by Valerie Tripp

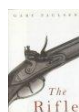
[Phoebe the Spy](#) by Judith Griffin
