


[Al Capone Does My Shirts](#) by Jennifer Choldenko (*J CHO*)


[Out Of My Mind](#) by Sharon Draper (*J DRA*)


[Joey Pigza Swallowed the Key](#) by Jack Gantos (*J GAN*)


[Absolutley Almost](#) by Lisa Graff (*J GRA*)

Ida B spends happy hours being home-schooled and playing in her family's apple orchard, until circumstances force her parents to sell part of the orchard and send her to public school.




[Rules](#) by Cynthia Lord (*J LOR*)

Frustrated at life with an autistic brother, twelve-year-old Catherine longs for a normal existence but her world is further complicated by a friendship with a young paraplegic.




[Loser](#) by Jerry Spinelli (*J SPI*)


[Liar and Spy](#) by Rebecca Stead (*J STE*)
