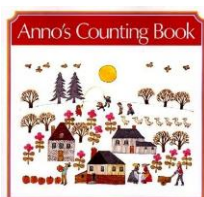

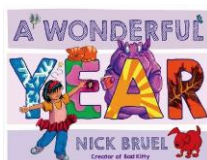
PICTURE BOOKS

A picture book comically following one girl through each of the four seasons.

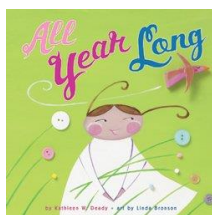

Easy rhyming text describes how plants grow and respond to seasonal changes.

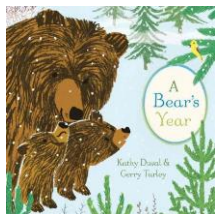

A rhyming celebration of the cycles of the seasons and the beauty of the natural world.

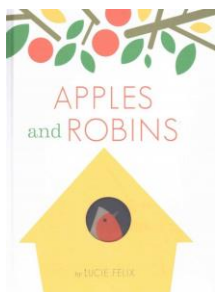

Illustrations and simple, rhyming text describe a year in the lives of bears as they journey through the seasons and raise their young.

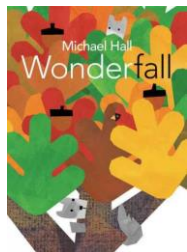

Using die-cut pages the story explores the shapes and colors of an apple tree through the passing of the seasons.

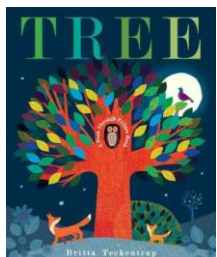

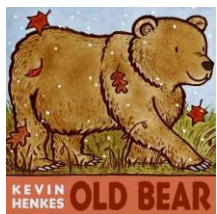

A book with peek-through holes that let children view the changes in a tree throughout the four seasons.

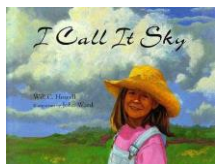

When Old Bear falls asleep for the winter, he has a dream that he is a cub again, enjoying each of the four seasons.

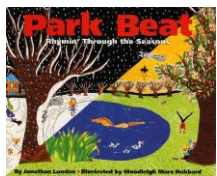

Children enjoy the summer breeze, fall fog, winter snow, and spring wind.

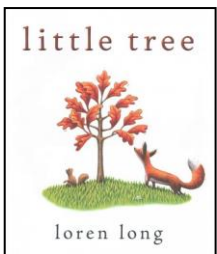

Rhyming text describes activities and sights during the four seasons.

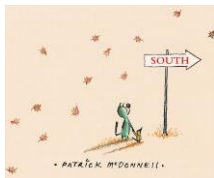

Long, Lauren. [Little Tree](#)

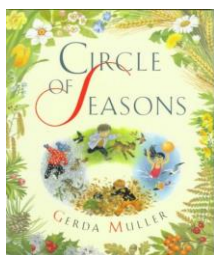

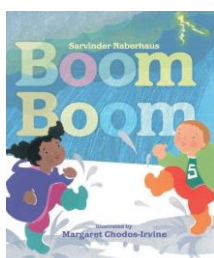

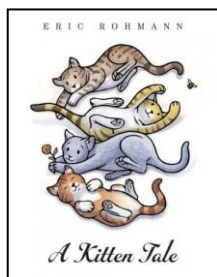
Naberhaus, Sarvinder. [Boom Boom](#)

Pak, Kenard. [Goodbye Summer, Hello Autumn](#)

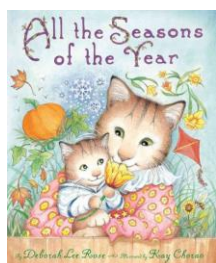
In a simple, evocative conversation with nature, a young girl witnesses how the season changes from summer to autumn.

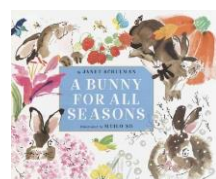

Describes in rhymed text how a mother cat's love for her kitten will last through the seasons of a lifetime.

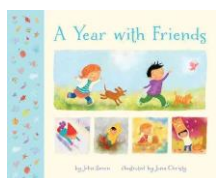

A little brown bunny enjoys visiting a garden from summer to spring, especially when a gray bunny shares the fun.

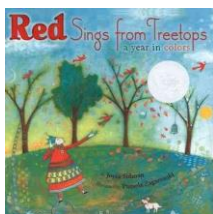

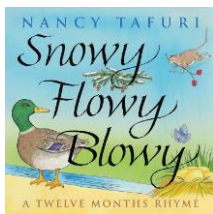
Friends celebrate the seasons and enjoy activities through the months of the year.

Sidman, Joyce. [Red Sings from Treetops: A Year in Color](#)

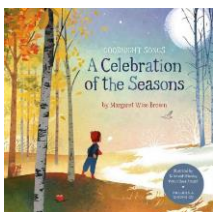
Nature displays different colors to announce the seasons of the year.

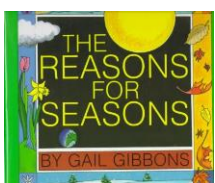
NON-FICTION

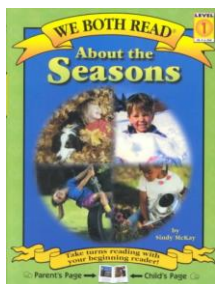

A clearly illustrated and simply explained description of how seasons are caused by the positions of the Earth and the Sun also discusses the delights of each of the seasons.

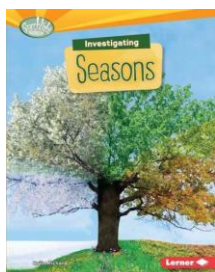

Explores the seasons through the changing weather patterns and the changing activities of both children and animals.

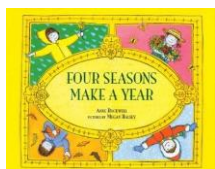

Eye-catching photos, informative captions, and succinct yet engaging text introduce young readers to the cycle of the seasons.

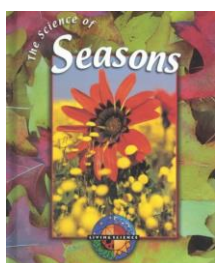

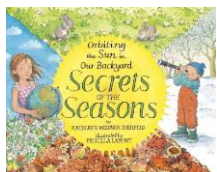
Strudwick, Leslie. [The Science of Seasons](#)
