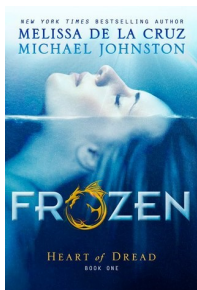


Shiver by Maggie Stiefvater

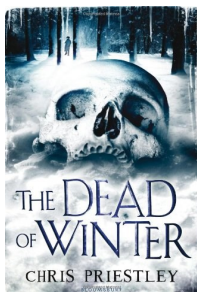


Frozen by Melissa de la Cruz

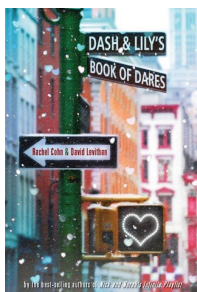


The Dead of Winter by Chris Priestley
