



A story of a Jewish survivor of Hitler's Europe and his son, a cartoonist who tries to come to terms with his father's story and history itself.






Still I Rise: A Graphic History of African Americans by Roland Laird








Little Fish by Ramsey Beyer




Rapunzel's Revenge by Shannon Hale (Rapunzel's Revenge series, book 1)






Through the Woods by Emily Carroll




Legend by Marie Lu, adapted by Leigh Dragoon (Legend series, book 1)






Newsprints by Ru Xu


Zeus: King of the Gods by George O'Connor


Annie Sullivan and the Trials of Helen Keller by Joseph Lambert






