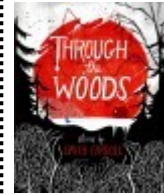
#### Great Falls by Steve Watkins

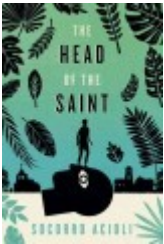


#### 5 to 1 by Holly Bodger
