SPOTLIGHT ON HISTORY: Suffolk County Almshouse



On April 1, 1817, the trustees of the Town of Brookhaven voted to open a poorhouse in conjunction with the towns of Islip and Smithtown. Located just east of the Davis House on Middle Country Road in Coram, the Town Poorhouse served the impoverished and elderly residents of the three towns. The Poorhouse remained in use until 1871, when the residents of the home were transferred to the newly built Suffolk County Almshouse in Yaphank. Situated on a 170-acre farm, the Almshouse was a three-story building with two wings: the east wing for women and the west wing for men. There were on average 125 residents ranging in age

from infants to centenarians. A separate orphanage was built near the Almshouse in 1896 for children aged 2-16. Called the Suffolk County Children's Home, it remained open until 1919 when it was replaced by the foster care system.

Although the county's towns contributed to the care of their residents, the Suffolk County Almshouse was designed to be self-supporting. All able-bodied residents worked either on the farm or in trades such as basketmaking, carpentry, or shoemaking. Due to state law, the Almshouse became known as the Suffolk County Home in 1929. It remained open until 1938, when the new Suffolk County Home was built. Today, the site of the Almshouse is occupied by Cornell Extensions Suffolk County Farm, the Suffolk County Board of Elections, and other county buildings. The Almshouse House Cemetery, used from 1872 to 1953, is south of the LIE at Exit 67.

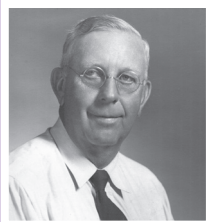

Details to know before you go:

Do not follow Google or Apple Maps. The cemetery is along the south side of the Long Island Expressway and is accessible from the eastbound Exit 67 entrance. From Main Street in Yaphank, go south on Yaphank Ave and follow the signs to the eastbound direction of the LIE. Park along the side of the ramp; a staff member will direct you to the site. There will be a brief walk along a path in the woods to get to the cemetery. Please be prepared for the weather and ticks, as this is an outdoor event in an open grassy field.

2024-2025 Annual Budget Vote & Trustee Election

A Few Statistics from 2023

- More than 489,000 physical items were checked out or renewed. In addition, eBooks, movies, music and audiobooks were streamed or downloaded more than 181,000 times, a 10% increase over the previous year.
- Computers were used more than 37,000 times, and the library's wireless network was accessed more than 117,000 times. These represent increases of 25% and 5% over the prior year.
- Library staff planned and produced 2,027 in-person or virtual programs with 38,351 attendees or viewers, a 12% increase over the previous year.
- The library's convenient mobile app was launched more than 33,000 times during the year.

The Library Board of Trustees is committed to continuing to offer excellent library service while keeping the budget as low as possible. We thank you for your support throughout the year, and ask you to come in and vote on April 9.

Annual Message to the Community

2023 was another very busy year at the library!

Our staff was excited to re-introduce some pre-pandemic programs, such as bus trips and the ever-popular Life-Sized Candyland. In conjunction with our status as a certified Sustainable Library, we launched the NexTrex Challenge, helping our community take soft plastic film out of the waste stream. We introduced the community to the Great Backyard Bird Count, a fantastic national citizen science program. New services were added to the makerLAB with a sublimation printer, which allows for more creative experiences for our patrons. We upgraded our wireless network with a faster and more reliable system, improving internet access for mobile users in the building. Many great new programs were planned and presented by our staff, including our first-ever Plant Swap, a Craft Supply Swap, the Kovarik Author Talk with Ridley Pearson, and Magic Tree House: the Musical, just to name a few. We embarked on some new collaborations: partnering with LIEOC to present high-quality English language classes for our English language learners, and collaborating with other libraries in the county for the fun Summer Library Tour. As always, we continue to enhance our collections: new travel-related items were added to our Equipment & Gadgets collection, and in the Teen Department, a new set of tablets with full manga series were added. At the end of December, our Circulation Department introduced the convenient option for patrons to renew their library cards online.

Since the inception of the state tax cap, the library has annually operated within those limits, with the exception of two years during the building expansion. In the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the library Board of Trustees decided that the library would have no budget increase, which became challenging due to the price fluctuations from supply chain issues. Subsequently there have been several years of steep inflation. As a result, the Board of Trustees has determined that in order to maintain the library's current level of excellent service, the proposed 2024-2025 budget will need to exceed the state tax cap. The anticipated increase for the average household is \$1.75 per month (\$21.01 per year). Details of the proposed budget are shown here and will be available in the library and online in early March. The Board will hold a budget information meeting on Wednesday, March 27 at 7:00 pm.

Completed petitions for library trustee are due by 5:00 pm on Monday, March 11, and information about trustee candidates will be available in the library and on our website shortly thereafter. There is one five-year term seat on the Board of Trustees that is up for election.

The proposed operating budget for 2024-2025 exceeds the NYS tax cap. It is estimated that the adoption of this budget will raise the library's tax rate to \$16.66 per \$100 of assessed valuation. This would increase the average homeowner's tax payment by \$21.01 per year or \$1.75 per month.
