SPOTLIGHT ON HISTORY: Irving Berlin and Camp Upton

In 1918, noted songwriter Irving Berlin was drafted into the U.S. Army. Born in Russia as Israel Baline, Berlin had become a US citizen only weeks before he was called up to serve. He was sent to Camp Upton in Yaphank and was assigned to the 20th Infantry, 152nd Depot Brigade; however, General Bell, commander of Camp Upton, soon realized that Berlin would be a better fit as an entertainer for the troops instead of a soldier. General Bell promoted Berlin to the rank of sergeant and assigned him the role of creating a musical revue to raise the morale of his fellow soldiers. In addition to the show, General Bell wanted to raise funds for a community house at Camp Upton. Legend has it that Berlin used this opportunity to negotiate a schedule that better suited his late hours of songwriting. In exchange for creating the show, *Yip! Yip! Yaphank!* Berlin was allowed to disregard the dreaded morning bugle call and miss reporting at reveille.

Yip! Yip! Yaphank! was an all-male soldier-produced musical revue that featured acrobatics, dancers, and jugglers, in addition to military drills choreographed to music by Berlin. Berlin wrote his most recognized song for this show, "God Bless America," but felt that it didn't fit the overall upbeat nature of the production and removed it from the lineup. *Yip! Yip! Yaphank!* had a two-month run on Broadway with 32 performances, raising over \$83,000 to create the community house at Camp Upton, although it was never built. For the finale, "We're on Our Way to France," the whole company wore their full gear and marched out of the theater, down the aisles, and out to the street. However, on the night of the final performance in September 1918, the audience saw the usual ending, but this time, after the main performers marched through the aisles, Sgt. Irving Berlin and the rest of the crew were similarly dressed and marched out of the theater. The men were actually going off to war and heading to France.

In 1941, Berlin used *Yip! Yip! Yaphank!* as the basis for a new play called *This Is The Army*. The show benefitted the Army Emergency Relief Fund and was taken worldwide to entertain American troops, earning \$10 million during its three-year run. As for "God Bless America," Berlin offered Kate Smith the song for her radio show, and on November 11, 1938, Smith sang the song for the first time in honor of the 20th anniversary of Armistice Day. Today, "God Bless America" is regularly sung at sporting events across the country.
