Spotlight on History:

Benjamin Tallmadge Historic Trail

Have you ever wondered about the Benjamin Tallmadge Trail that runs through the Longwood District? Major Benjamin Tallmadge was a Revolutionary War officer who was born in Setauket in 1754. He graduated from Yale and served as a teacher in Connecticut before he was commissioned as a Lieutenant in the army in 1776. He quickly moved up the ranks and was promoted to captain and then major of the 1st Troop of the Second Dragoons. The following year, he was vital in forming the Culper Spy Ring that would relay information to General George Washington, with Tallmadge assuming the name "John Bolton" to use when supplying information to the network of spies.

In November 1780, Tallmadge received orders from General George Washington to raid the Manor of St. George in Mastic, which at the time was a garrison of British soldiers called Fort St. George. Tallmadge and his dragoons were also to burn a large supply of hay the British stockpiled for the winter. On November 21, 1780, Tallmadge and his men rowed across Long Island Sound from Fairfield, Connecticut, to Cedar Beach in Mount Sinai. After sheltering under their boats for the night due to a storm, they proceeded to the south shore, where they captured and burned down Fort St. George. On their march back to Mt. Sinai, Tallmadge stopped in Coram and ordered the burning of 300 tons of hay, which the British had been stockpiling for the winter.

During the raid, Tallmadge and his dragoons traveled 20 miles by water and 40 miles on land, suffering no casualties. The British lost seven men, and the remainder were taken prisoners and brought back to Fairfield. For these efforts, Tallmadge received the thanks of Congress and a personal congratulatory letter from George Washington.

Today, Tallmadge and his raid on Fort St. George are remembered through the historic trail that cuts through parts of the Longwood community. While the exact route is unknown, the trail passes through Middle Island, Yaphank, and Coram. It commemorates Tallmadge and his impact on local and national history.

After the British won the battle of Brooklyn and occupied Long Island, Major Benjamin Tallmadge led a series of successful raids to harass the British troops. General George Washington also tapped Tallmadge to lead an espionage ring of Long Island Spies. Come hear local historian Robert von Bernewitz discuss how the Long Island Culper Spy Ring played a major role in winning the Revolutionary War, and take a photographic journey down the Tallmadge Trail that runs through our district.
