Budget Vote and Trustee Election Info


We anticipate that the Annual Budget Vote for 2021-2022 will take place on Tuesday, April 6, in the library's Community Room. The vote will be conducted using paper ballots. An election for one seat on the Library Board of Trustees will be held; the term of office is five years. District residents interested in serving as library trustee may obtain a petition from the Director's office, beginning Monday, February 8. Petitions with a minimum of 114 district resident signatures are due by 5:00 pm on Monday, March 8. Please note that vote dates or other details may need to be adjusted due to COVID-19.





In order to receive community service credit when attending a program on Zoom, your camera must be turned on and facing you for the entire length of the program. The librarian must be able to see you working independently on the project.

Book Review

To become a teen reviewer, select a book from our "New Fiction" section that has been published in the current or immediately preceding year. Then, draft a review based on our teen reviewer guidelines, which can be found on the library's website.

Curbside Community Service
