

Library Update

We are living in unprecedented times. How many times have we heard that over the last few months? But it really is true. When the Library Board of Trustees and administration made the decision to close the library building in mid-March, I never imagined that our building would still be closed to the public in June. And not just our library, but every public library in Suffolk County.

I hope you all know how hard our staff worked from home to bring you library services over the past few months. LPL staff has been providing and assisting with online materials, answering emails and chat sessions, creating and updating library accounts, ordering new materials, and offering many creative virtual programs for all ages. I am so proud of the work our staff has done, especially during this challenging time.

Here's a snapshot of some of our statistics during the building closure, for just the months of April and May:

- 29,860 electronic books, audiobooks, magazines, movies and songs have been checked out, streamed or downloaded
- · 318 temporary library cards have been issued
- · 25,777 people have attended or viewed one of our 165 virtual events including storytimes, cooking classes, informational lectures, online book discussions, one-onone career meetings, and more

Our reopening plan is phased, much like the NY Forward plan released by our state government. We entered the first stage of LPL's reopening plan on June 1, when staff began returning to work in the building. We had a backlog of things to catch up on, such as the 50 boxes of new books and other materials that were delivered in just one day. More importantly, our staff had

a lot of new procedures to learn: safer ways to receive deliveries, how to use PPE, instituting social distancing requirements, new safety procedures for receiving and lending library materials, and so much more.

In mid-June we moved to the second phase of our reopening when we began a brand-new service for our patrons: curbside pickup! So far this has been very popular with our patrons, and we are so happy to get physical materials back in the hands of our patrons.

I know many of you are wondering when the library will open its doors to the public, and as of this writing (on June 18), we do not have a date set. Our utmost priority, now and always, is the health and safety of our staff and patrons. And at this time, the safest way we can provide service is through online services and curbside pickup. I can promise you that we are working hard to create a plan for the future, and as soon as we can safely allow people back into our building, we will. There is no roadmap for this situation, and like you, we are doing our best to make the right decisions, even when they are tough. The best way to stay updated on the library's reopening status is to subscribe to our eNewsletter, or to follow us on social media.

The library's mission is to provide the best library service in the most sustainable way to the Longwood community. I believe the LPL staff has succeeded in making library service as accessible and sustainable as it can be in this difficult time. We are all looking forward to the day we can see you walk through our doors again. Until that time, I wish good health to you and your loved ones. Even if the library building is physically closed, the library staff is here for you.

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


